Premier Sport	£1,260.00 – Games £625.00 – Dance £1,080.00 – Gym £1,080.00 – Games/Athletics (Total - £4,045.00)	All EYs, KS1 and KS2 pupils	This year we again have the same coach all year which will allow children to make a deeper bond with him, and also he can get to know the staff well and vice versa. So far Mr Jones has been very good with the children and has delivered good lessons. Areas of PE covered in the Autumn Term are Multi-skills in KS1 and Netball and ball skills in KS2. In the Spring term the children had gym. We also benefitted by having a dance teacher for Spring 1. The teachers who take part in the lessons have made notes which they can use in future lessons. All children have benefitted from his specialist teaching and will continue to do so in the future. Mr Jones has devised his own games that the children have been playing on their own at playtime.
Premier Sport Lunchtime club	£925.00	KS1 and KS2	This year we offered a lunchtime club on a rolling programme that each child in year 1-4 will benefit from for 2 half terms this year.
Life Bus	£340.00	All pupils	Children learned how to eat properly, keep hydrated and why it was important. They learned about various organs in the body. They also learned about emotions, both theirs and others.

Children have been creating competitions amongst themselves and have been timing how long it takes to do a certain amount of reps. Redborne School Sports Partnership Buyback Programme	£2000.00	All KS1 and KS2 pupils	Through the Buyback Programme we have access to a wide range of competitive sports festivals throughout the year for KS1 and KS2. The children who attend each festival have the chance to compete against their peers from other local schools in the Redborne family, usually from the HAST pyramid.
Tennis Coaching	£360.00	12 hours	This tennis coaching took place in Summer 2016 but was only invoiced in September 2016.

Attitudes: Attitudes to learning in general are more positive and this is shown during PE lessons in the cooperation and engagement of all pupils, children that were reluctant to participate in PE at the beginning of the Autumn term are now fully and happily engaging in the lessons.

Behaviours: Children are more engaged in learning and behaviour has improved this year. They are taking games learned during PE and playing them in the playground.

Skills: Children in all classes have been learning new skills and further developing existing skills in PE with the Premier Sports coach. Children in KS1 have also been working on coordination, agility, balance and fitness in Gym and Dance lessons benefitting from teaching skills developed during last year's Premier sports lessons.
