Why go to Forest School?

Forest School is linked to the curriculum: it supports many areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework and the National Curriculum.

Observations by Forest Leaders allow them to tailor support to the children's stage of development.

What to wear in Forest School:

To allow the pupils to participate fully the correct clothing is essential for Forest School. All participants need to bring:

- Wellingtons/sturdy walking boots
- Long trousers/ long sleeved top
- Jumper/Sweatshirt
- Waterproof coat and trousers
- Hat, gloves and thick socks in Autumn/ Winter months
- Sun hat and sun cream in Summer

These need to be old clothes as we do not intend to stay clean!

Forest School is an exciting educational experience for children, held in a woodland setting, offering and innovative approach to outdoor play and learning.

The concept originated in Sweden in the 1950s and was developed throughout other Scandinavian countries.

Our philosophy of Forest school is to encourage and inspire children through an educational approach to outdoor play and learning, inspired by their own interests. Children have a variety of first hand experiences whilst in Forest School, to support learning and development across the curriculum.

Children will use tools and play, to learn about the boundaries of behavior, both physical and social. This enables them to grow in confidence and self-esteem, and to become self motivated.

The fun starts with the preparation for the visit, as the children put on their outdoor clothes, sing songs and share stories en-route to the forest.
